
- 39,438 as of 3/30/2019

Key Observations

- **Highest registration** in the past six years
- Membership **grew 11%**
- In-House (Tier 4) *grew 27%*
- Tier 1 and 2 decreased 5%
 - This is expected with the increase of DA and ECNL teams.

Key Opportunities

- Continue to grow and identify In-House programs
- Work to partner with Clubs to register all players, even ECNL and DA to facilitate investments (Referees, Fields, Education) in the game.

Accomplishments



- Increased Registration by 5,000
- Talks with AYSO

- Delivered \$75,000 in sponsorship, not counting "in kind" with \$55,000 being multi-year agreements

Cups/Update COMPLETE



Achievements

- 2 events on the same 3 weekends made the Staff, Trainer, Support Staff etc. Coverage easier to coordinate and less of a grind for key Staff.
- 64 Different Exception requests by teams for scheduling due to Prom, SAT, Dallas Cup, etc. were honored.
- Staffed with field marshalls, board volunteers, and ASA Staff which had a correlation to survey results
- 82-95% responded easy to find staff, Medical Staff, or support staff.
- FIELD QUALITY: 90% rated Tucson Kino above average or Excellent(Pres cup 57%). 81-88% rating for Reach 11. 94% for Grande Sports World (47%P Cup)
- 90-93% rated communication before and during event as Above Average or Excellent
- Overall rating for cup experience received 93% rating above average or Excellent. (84%P Cup)

Lessons or Opportunities

- Playing weekday games changes the financial model, budget, unit cost (in terms of Staff, Trainer, Support Staff, etc.). Coverage and is very difficult.
- 48% of responses stated should play both weekday and weekend (38% P Cup). 27% responded weekend only (37%. P Cup)
- 59% respondents stated Shirt is preferred over medals (67% preferred Medals for P Cup).
- FIELD QUALITY: 53-57% rated SSC above average or Excellent. 68% rating for Strikers Complex(41%P Cup)
- Need to improve Club/Team responsibility for technical area and allowed staff.

- Only Girls U17 is guaranteed to have more than one (1) team participate in ASL2 for any age group.
- No girls teams were declined for any of the Advanced Leagues.
- Total of 261 teams, only 34 (including Wait List and ASL2 Play In) come are from Tucson (13%)
