


AYSA Overview










AYSA Organization Chart

Observations:

- Red cards are part of the game. As Clubs the biggest opportunity will be to eliminate negative behavior directed towards officials (Irresponsible Bench Behavior, Abusive Language towards Official)
- ❖ AYSA has no visibility into red cards issued during non-sanctioned tournaments.









Referee Update



There continues to be significant focus on referee development with outstanding support from Clubs in providing support with access to fields to allow for more on-field training versus just classroom training. With that focus some key observations include:

- ❖Overall referee numbers remain flat year-over-year. Approximately 700-800 new referees certify each year, but attrition is equal to new certifications. Reasons include:
 - Many leave to college
 - ❖ Several have serviced the game for a long time and have elected to step away
 - ❖ State Referee Committee has not done well in communicating the timing, location, requirements etc.. on what is needed not only to become certified to referee, but also following up with active referees to encourage and ensure they recertify.
 - ❖ Sideline behavior/referee abuse continues to be an issue

Highlights from the past year include:

- Tyler Cudmore recognized as the Young Male Referee of the Year for Arizona and Region IV (third year in a row that Arizona won this award.)
- Arizona referees were select for National Presidents Cup and National Championships for the third year in a row
 - ❖ Bryan Perez and Cormac McCarthy were selected for the National Presidents Cup
 - Mario Coss and Isaiah Vlad were selected for US Youth Nationals










US Soccer President - Update
