Important Documents

Credentials/Passes

Each player and team official must have a US Youth Soccer member pass issued by ASA. Credentials must be worn around the neck by all personnel within the technical/bench area.

Only 4 team officials permitted in the technical/bench area during the match.

• DOCs included in the 4.

All team officials in the technical/bench area must be on the match card.

 Coaches/other officials may be written in during team check in prior to the first whistle.



Uniforms (including jerseys, shorts, and socks) must be identical.	 Minor variations may be allowed, subject to approval by tournament staff and the Referee Jersey numbers
Numbers must be permanently affixed to jersey	• May <u>not</u> be taped on (without ASA approval)
Goalkeepers	 Recommend numbers but not required Different color than same or opposing team
Must have <u>two</u> sets of jerseys differing in color	 Home team: lighter color Away team: darker color If similar, AWAY team must change

Team Uniforms

Each team must check in with the referees <u>at least 15-30</u> <u>minutes prior to kick off.</u>

ASA will **provide** match cards to the referees for all matches.

Each team needs to bring physical player passes for players and bench personnel. Every coach/admin who will be in the technical area must be on the roster. If they are not, they can be written in during the team's check-in (must be done prior to start of match)

Team Check-In Procedures

All spectators are required to sit on the opposite side of the field from the teams and directly across from their respective team. Coaches and/or team officials are responsible for ensuring that their spectators behave appropriately at all times.

ASA will not tolerate poor sportsmanship or disruptive behavior from any spectator.

Substitutions

12U, 13U, and 14U age groups – UNLIMITED

15U, 16U, 17U, and 19U age groups – A maximum of 7 substitutions shall be allowed in each game during each half of play and during overtime play. After leaving the game during a half of play, the substituted player may not re-enter the game during the same half of play. After leaving the game during overtime play, the substituted player may not re-enter the game.

Rule 12.5.7

Weather & Postponed Games

If we have extended weather delays, matches can be shortened per rule **12.5.6**

Any game terminated after the completion of the first half will be considered a complete game, and the score at that point will be final.

Weather delay communications will be communicated through Stack Team App and posted on the Gotsport Schedule page.

Water Breaks can only be authorized by ASA staff. ASA will communicate all Water Breaks with teams and referees.

Red Cards/Sus pensions

Players dismissed/sent off from a match may be required to leave the team bench area.

Players serving a suspension must check in with the team and inform the referee that they will be serving a suspension in the upcoming match.

- May sit in technical area, cannot be in uniform
- Must have suspension fulfillment form signed by referee

Anyone involved in a fight will be suspended immediately.

* All Arizona Advanced Leagues and Open League red cards that have not be fulfilled will be served during State Cup.

* Yellow cards do not accumulate from one match to the match.


Hate Speech Policy for CUPS Applies to any player, coach, assistant coach, trainer, manager, or staff member who receives a red card for hate speech or who is overheard and reported by an official for using language deemed hate speech, whether direct or indirect, by that official, during events that are part of the National Championships cycles, will be immediately removed from participation in that cycle at the local, regional, and national levels.

The Rules Have Changed for Referee Abuse Penalties Help Make Sure Your Soccer Community Is Prepared

In March 2025, U.S. Soccer's updated Referee Abuse Prevention Policy (Policy 531-9) takes effect. This policy update includes clearer definitions for physical and non-physical abuse – as well as stronger suspensions for reported referee abuse.

Referee Abuse Policy



Protests/Appeals

Notification must be orally lodged by a team official listed on the team roster involved in the game with the Referee and with the tournament director within 30 minutes of the end of the match

Protest must be filed online in Gotsport by a team official listed on team roster within 3 hours of the conclusion of the match. Tournament director should also be notified prior to leaving the field.

*This includes fees, paid-fees are nonrefundable

An appeal of the Protest and Appeals Committee decisions must be submitted online on GotSport Forms – 2025 State Cup/Presidents Cup Appeal Submission within 3 hours of written notification of the decision.
