- Teams interested in participating in the 2025–2026 season must complete registration by June 27.
- Each team will typically play 7 to
   12 matches, depending on the
   size of their division.
- Boys and Girls U11–U14: Season runs from September 5 through March 1.
- Boys and Girls U15–U19: Season also runs from September 5 through March 1, with a break scheduled to accommodate high school seasons.

### **COMPETITIVE PATHWAYS**







- Arizona Premier League (APL) represents the highest level of competition within ASA's league system. Entry into the APL is based on team performance from previous seasons, including league standings, tournament results, and overall competitiveness. APL features top-tier teams competing at an elite level and provides a platform for players and clubs aiming for regional and national exposure. Top-performing teams in APL may also earn promotion to the US Youth Soccer Desert Conference, offering additional opportunities for high-level competition across the region.
- ASL1 (Arizona State League 1) is the top division within the ASL structure and includes some of
  the strongest competitive teams in Arizona. Placement in ASL1 is performance-based, relying
  on results from previous seasons and tournament play. It serves as a steppingstone to APL
  and prepares teams for high-level competition and exposure.
- ASL2 (Arizona State League 2) serves as a developmental tier for competitive teams that are
  not yet ready for ASL1 or APL. It provides a challenging environment where teams can grow
  and demonstrate their ability to move up the competitive ladder. Placement in ASL2 is
  determined through an application process and league committee evaluation.
- MaxInMotion Open League, managed by the Arizona Soccer Association (ASA), is a statewide competitive league designed for youth soccer teams that are not currently placed in ASA's higher-tier leagues, such as the Arizona Premier League (APL) or Arizona State League (ASL). It provides an accessible platform for developing teams to gain competitive experience, improve performance, and work toward future promotion into ASL 2.
